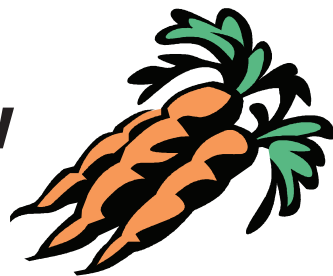


Cropwell Bishop Horticultural Show

The Old School

The first ever Horticultural Show in the Village—as far as we know. The Show is just one of the events taking place during the Cropwell Feast weekend and during the day there will be other shows and activities taking place at The Old School such as: drinks and cakes for sale,



How to enter:

1. Look inside this leaflet to see all the different Show categories. Are you growing any of them? We want the Show to be a fun event and encourage all the 'ordinary back garden' and allotment growers to enter. You don't have to be in any kind of club, just someone who has grown a vegetable or flower themselves. There are also categories for Cooking, Photographs. There is a separate category for children's entries. See back cover for full Rules.
2. Get a pen and a copy of the Entry Form. A copy is enclosed with this leaflet. More copies can be downloaded from the CropwellBishopPlan.co.uk website ('Allotment' tab) or from shop counters in Cropwell Bishop. Complete your entry form and put it with your entry fee into an envelope. Write 'Show' on the front. Put the envelope into the Community Box in the Post Office. The charge is 30p per entry (or only 25p per entry if you are submitting 4 or more). Entries from children are free. Closing date for entries is Friday 9th September.
3. Tend your crops and flowers in the intervening weeks!
4. On the day of the Show, Saturday 17th September, bring your entry to The Old School between 8.00am and 9.00am. Paper plates will be reserved for you on the tables—you just need to arrange your exhibits on them.

Timetable for Saturday 17th September:

8.00am - 9.00amSet up your entries at The Old School
9.00am - 11am..... Main Hall closed whilst judging takes place
11am - 2.00pmHall open for viewing: free entry
2.00pm - 3.00pm..... Presentation of awards and auction of donated produce
3.00pm approx Treasure trail to the Memorial Hall

Show Rules

1. All entries, including young people's classes, must be the sole work of the exhibitor, all of whom must be of amateur status.
2. Produce must be grown in exhibitors own garden or allotment.
3. Notes on vegetable entries: carrots and parsnips must have foliage trimmed back to 3" (7.5 cm); peas and beans must be displayed with some stalk attached; tomatoes must be displayed with their calyx present (the green 'leaves' between the tomato and stem).
4. All cookery exhibits must be displayed on a white paper plate, plain doilies may be used. (Plates and doilies will be available). Exhibitors of flowers are to provide their own vases or appropriate containers and be responsible for collecting them after the show.
5. Only stewards may move entries once they have been placed by competitors.
6. One entry form per entrant, photocopies of form are acceptable. Entry forms to be returned by Friday 9th September 2011 to any committee member or via the 'Community Box' on the counter in the Post Office, Cropwell Bishop.
7. Entry fee is 30p per entry but only 25p per entry if you are submitting 4 or more entries. Entries from children are free.
8. All exhibits to be brought to The Old School between 8.00am and 9.00am on Saturday 17th September. Presentation of exhibits will be taken into account.
9. Judging will commence at 10.00am on 17th September. The judge's decision is final. During judging only judges and the committee shall be allowed in the Main Hall.
10. No exhibitor may be awarded more than one prize in any one class.
11. In all classes, points are awarded on the basis of 3 for 1st; 2 for 2nd and 1 for 3rd. The 'Best in Show Award' will be presented to the person with the most points.
12. The 'Family Award' is awarded to the family with most points. In the case of a tie the winner with the most first prizes will be awarded the trophy
13. To compete for the Family Award a minimum of 2 family members living at the same address must have submitted at least one entry each; one of the family members must be in Year 7 or below. An entry form is required from each family member entering and the box on the form for 'Family Entry' should be ticked.
14. Certificates will be awarded to winners. Prizes will also be presented to the winners of the 'Family Award' and the 'Best in Show Award'.
15. Any competitor wishing to lodge an objection must do so to the Chairman before 2.00pm on the day of the show.
16. We would very much like to auction off exhibits in the Fruit, Vegetable, Flower and Cookery categories (classes 1 to 5) after we have presented certificates and prizes at 2pm: we believe that this will add to the enjoyment of the Show. Proceeds will be donated to the Cropwell Feast. However, you are of course welcome to hold back your entry from the auction: details on how to do this will be provided before the Show.
17. No exhibit is to be removed from the Hall before 2.00pm. Exhibits that are not to be sold should be removed from the Hall by 2:15pm.
18. The committee shall have the power to deal with all matters not provided for in these rules. Whilst every reasonable precaution will be taken, the committee cannot be responsible for any loss or consequential damage. The Committee's decision is final.
